Principal's Report

Last week Berinba PS finalised the External Validation process. This process is undertaken by schools once within a five year cycle and involves significant work for staff in assessing practice against the School Excellence Framework. 
Skype Session with Author Mat Larkin








1/2H Classwork




- *Brody is always noticing the good work of others in the playground and letting the teacher's know.
