Thank you Barry , especially for all the extra fun things you do.



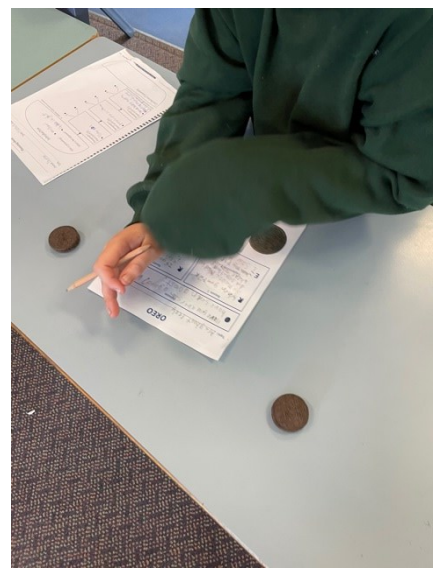
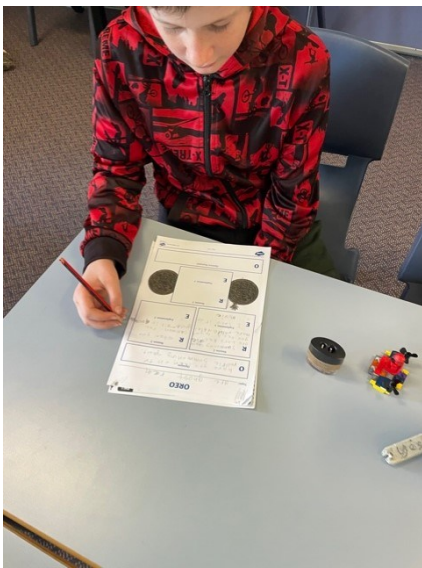
5/6MS

Term 2 and 5/6MS has settled quickly into class routines and learning.

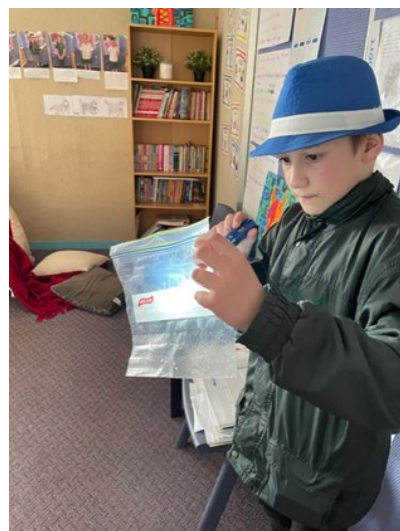
This week MS students were learning about the different parts that need to go into writing a persuasive paragraph.
