From the Principal...

Dear Berinba Community,

Every day as a principal brings something new and that's exactly what I love about this role. No two days are the same. One moment I might be visiting a classroom and sharing in that spark of understanding, and the next working with staff to shape learning programs and enrichment opportunities that make a real difference to your/our kids. I get to celebrate the small wins, support through challenges, and witness firsthand the resilience and creativity of our wonderful young people.

What I truly value most of all is the sense of community we have here at Berinba. I'm privileged to work with a team of dedicated educators who care deeply about their students, and with you,



the families who are engaged, supportive and invested in your child's growth. It's in these partnerships between school and home that real, lasting learning happens. That's the magic of education and what can only be referred to as the 'schooliness' of school.

Being a principal means wearing many hats, but at the heart of it all is the opportunity to help children feel seen, capable and excited about their future and what lies ahead, even when this may be unknow. As we move into the second half of the term, I'd like to take a moment to acknowledge the ongoing efforts of our students and staff. It's been a productive and positive term so far, and we're now turning our attention to the important process of semester reporting.

Teachers are currently working diligently to finalise student assessments and prepare end of semester reports. These reports provide a valuable snapshot of your child's progress, achievements, and areas for growth. We encourage you to take the time to read through them carefully when they are released in week 10. We will be offering parent/ teacher interviews early in term 3, which is another chance to speak with your child's teacher/s to celebrate learning and set goals together moving into the second half of the year. The upcoming reports will reflect both academic and social development, as we continue to prioritise the whole child approach to learning. Reports this year will be sent home in paper form and be kept in student record cards at school.

Staffing Changes

I also want to inform you of some changes to our school staffing. At Berinba we are fortunate to hold a positive reputation in our community and beyond with many teachers choosing our school as a place to work. We have welcomed new staff members this year, seen some of our staff take on opportunities to increase their influence wider than the school and others return and take on specialist roles, who bring experience and fresh perspectives, and we are also supporting transitions for staff taking on new roles or returning from leave.

From term 3, Lisa Pumpa will be returning to Berinba. Lisa will step back into the role of Assistant Principal of Special Education and class teacher of the students of the current MJ. With this, I want to take this opportunity to recognise and honour Fiona Jackson's leadership. Fiona's leadership has exemplified integrity, inclusivity, and purpose. Through Fiona's leadership, being grounded in values, guided by vision, and her authentic commitment to the collective good for the students in her care and the staff of Enriched learning and across our school.

While we are sad to see you go, we are equally excited to see what lies ahead for them.




Crazy Hair Day – Year 6 Student Leadership Fundraiser

This week's theme was all about Science and Technology, and our young explorers were eager to dive into the wonders of the world around them.

Science Adventures Galore!

Our budding scientists engaged in a variety of hands-on activities:

- Floating and Sinking: Discovering which objects float or sink in water.
- **Paper Airplanes:** Exploring aerodynamics by crafting and flying their own planes.
- Marble Runs: Understanding gravity through exciting marble track creations.
- **Push and Pull:** Learning about forces using toy cars.
- Magnet Magic: Investigating magnetic forces with rice and counters.
- **Dinosaur Digs:** Becoming paleontologists and unearthing dinosaur fossils.
- Leaf Insects: Observing living creatures and discussing their habitats.
- Habitat Building: Creating animal homes using natural materials and LEGO.
- Science Puzzles: Challenging young minds with themed puzzles.
- Tech Tinkering: Exploring tools and recycled computer parts to understand technology.
